			The Midland City Council selected the proposal from Pioneer Natural Resources which will invest \$120 million to improve the wastewater treatment plant in return for reclaimed water to be sold, at a reduced rate, to Pioneer Natural Resources for their fracking operations.					
			Currently, Pioneer uses 340,000 barrels of water a day for their drilling operations, of which slightly less than 50% of the water utilized is fresh water. With the proposed improvements, the Midland wastewater plant will be able to mitigate the proposed 10 million gallons of wastewater per day for the use of this project. This public private partnership with the City of Midland will ensure that Pioneer's Midland project will not only be able to rely solely on reclaimed wastewater, but be able to grow the project. By using wastewater, the City of Midland will have more access to fresh water to utilize in ways that would be beneficial for its citizens.
